Why is play important?

Play is the true work of a child. Children are busy when they are playing, and they are learning when they play. In the Early Years we provide lots of child led activities which allow children to use their imagination.

In the Early years we promote play through lots of different resources and activities e.g. scientific concepts; such as in the water tray identifying things that sink and float which could then link with mathematical concepts such as weighing and capacity

What is the Early Years Foundation Stage (E.Y.F.S)?

- The E.Y.F.S. is the stage of education for children from birth to the end of the Reception year.
 - It is based on the recognition that children learn best through play and active learning
 - It is developed around 4 themes that underpin the EYFS A Unique Child: Observe what a child is learning Positive Relationships: What adults can do Enabling Environments: What adults could provide Learning and Developing: Children's achievements through the above

Areas of learning

These areas are particularly crucial for igniting children's curiosity and enthusiasm for learning, and for building their capacity to learn, form relationships and thrive.

- Personal, Social and Emotional Development
- Communication and Language
- Physical Development

SPECIFIC AREAS

These are essential skills and knowledge for children to participate successfully in society. These areas also help develop their reading, writing and number skills.

- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the world
- Expressive arts and design

Baseline

We baseline your child at the beginning of the school year. This will be carried out through observations of each child during play.

- This takes place during the first 3 full time weeks in Reception.
- In the Autumn term we will discuss your child's baseline and
 - next steps at parents evening.

Attendance

- Pupil doors open at 8:40am & close promptly at 8:50am.
- If you arrive at school at 8.50am or later, you must go to the office.
- Parents are not allowed into the school once the doors are closed at 8:50am
- Children will need to be collected at 3.15pm from the KS1 playground. If you are running late, please let the school know.
- Children will be taken to our after school club and a charge will be made.

Attendance

- Attendance expectation is 95% and above
- Please let us know if you child is unwell and will not be attending school. Any absence requires a telephone call to the school office.
- Any sickness or diarrhea must be followed by at least 48 hours absence. This must a 48 hours clear of illness.
- Holidays are not to be taken in term time.
- If your child has an appointment during the school day, please let the school office know.

<u>A typical day in Reception - Autumn Term</u>

- 8.40am: Welcome, Register and early morning work
- 8.55am: Registration closes
- 9.00-10.15am: Adult led Input: Literacy or Maths then child led learning and access
- to the outdoor area
- 10.15-10.30am: Snack time
- 10.30 11.20am: Child led learning and access to the outdoor area 11.30 -11.55: Read, Write, Inc.
- 12.00 -1.00: Lunch
- 1.00 -1.15: Magical Maths
- 1.20 3.00pm: Child led learning alongside adult led tasks. Access to the outdoor area
- 3.00pm: Tidy away, Show and tell and circle time
- 3.15pm: Home time

Lunchtimes

- Your child is entitled to a free school meal. This can include:
- Hot school dinner
- School packed lunch
- Jacket potato or pasta option
- A vegetarian option is also available
- No halal option the vegetarian option will be given.
- Children also have access to salad and bread when choosing a school meal.
- Alternatively you can provide your child with a home packed lunch.

Allergies

Please ensure there are no nut products in your child's lunchbox. This includes traces of nuts in products such as chocolate spread.



Please speak to a member of staff if you child has allergies or dietary requirements.

Home Packed Lunch Reminders

- Fruit such as grapes, strawberries, blueberries should be cut up.
- Food cannot be re heated at school.
- No fizzy drinks
- No nut products
- No large chocolate bars or sweets
- Please do not over pack lunchboxes with too much food.



PAWS Club

- Our breakfast and after school club is available Monday to Fridays. Breakfast Club starts at 8am After School Club finishes at 5.30pm

What can you do to help your child's learning when they begin school?

- Sharing books, talking about the pictures
- Encourage mark making, shopping lists etc.
- Encourage children to talk and answer questions.
- Practise counting at any time-climbing the stairs, shopping etc.
- Play simple board games
- Sing number rhymes and songs together
- Support any homework that comes home
- Practise turn taking with a friend, sibling or relative
- Practise following 2 step instructions, i.e. "put your toys away and then get your coat.

The First Few Days

There can be a lot to remember in the first few days, but please do not worry! Your child will quickly be teaching you the routine 🙂

- All clothing named
- Red school book bag everyday <u>*No Rucksacks*</u>
- Wellies and spare set of uniform named and left in school
- No hooped earrings or jewellery to be worn
- A water bottle please ensure this is clearly named
- Toys/items/comforters from home cannot be brought into school
- Ensure you have spoken to your child about their lunch choice.
- Shoes named and velcro no laces please

Other Matters

- Please let us know if someone different is collecting your child. The office must also be informed of this so please phone or email prior to your child being collected (even if this person is on your list of contacts). For safeguarding reasons, the person must bring ID with them. If this is a regular friend/relative collecting, they will still require ID whilst staff get used to all the new faces!
- You will receive news and information over the school year via email, text or Tapestry. Please ensure the school have all up to date information.

Other Matters

• Playground entrance - You will enter through the main KS1 gate and wait on the playground. Please wait behind the red line until your childs teacher comes out. Children will walk across the red line independently and line up with their teacher. They will then be taken into the classroom. If you need to speak to a member of staff, please wait at the red line and someone will come over to you. Getting the children into class safely is our first priority.

Please return your admission forms, proof of address and birth certificate to the main school office ASAP

• These visits will take place in the EYFS classrooms and garden. You will be able to meet the staff and ask any questions you may have.

- •Parents can add their own comments. videos and photos from home.
- EYFS homework will be set through Tapestry.

Why Do We Use Tapestry?

- oIt increases the time spent interacting and playing with the children.
- oIt gives us as practitioners more time to spend planning and creating exciting learning opportunities rather than printing, cutting, sticking etc into books.
- oIt creates a two way communication between the EYFS team and the parents and carers.
- oIt enables us to show what the children really do at school which will give opportunities to extend the children at home.
