Phonics games explained!

Play eye spy with your child. "I spy with my little eye something that sounds like c-a-t".

Hunt around and take pictures of items starting will all of the letter sounds.

Can you find an item for each sound?

Choose one of your favourite books and search the words for particular sounds. How many can you find?

Use a spray bottle to squirt tricky words that have been chalked onto the floor or wall.

Choose a range of items that begin or end in a particular sound. Arrange these items on a tray and have your child cover their eyes. Can they figure out which one has been removed? Play Simon says by sound talking each word. "Simon says touch your b-a-ck".

Pick a body part. Think of words that rhyme with your body part. These can be real or nonsense words. Discuss the meaning of each word if they are real. Chalk hopscotch onto the floor. Fill in the squares with tricky words and play. Read each word as you hop on them.

Chalk letter sounds on the floor. Shout out a sound and jump on the correct one. Can you say a word that has that sound in it?

Find natural resources outside and use them to form letter sounds and words. Write the sounds on pieces of paper and ask an adult to hide them around the room. Can you find the sounds?

Chalk tricky words onto the floor. Walk across the words and verbally use the word in a sentence.

Pick a word and start tig.

Use your play dough recipe to make play dough. Shape the play dough to represent different sounds from the sound mat. Collect some rocks and write the sounds on them. Can you make words using the rocks?

Write tricky words onto empty bottles. Bowl them down and read the words you managed to knock over.
