Phonics games explained!

Adults are to use their finger to draw the letter sound on the child's back. Do they know what the sound is?

Take some time to write a letter or draw pictures to family and friends.

If you have a water pistol, spray bottle or nerf gun. Shoot sounds dotted around when they're called!

Hide an item behind your back. Describe what it is. Can they guess what it is? Take turns!

Pretend to be a newsreader and film a broadcast. What's happening in your house or the world today?

Wear a blindfold and listen carefully. Adults can use a range of items to make different sounds. Can you hear them? What are they?

Write out rhyming words and then hide them round the room. Can your child find them and match them up again?

Write tricky words on the floor with chalk. Use a brush of some sort to scrub the word away. Don't forget to read it first!

Use magnetic letters if you have them to match uppercase and lowercase letters together.

Use a plain candle if you have one to write tricky words. Your child can paint over with watery paints and discover them!

Make your own set of dominoes using letter sounds. Match upper and lowercase or just recognise the sounds!

Write tricky words inside a zip lock bag. Fill it with paint and let the children try to find the words hidden!

Write sounds on playdough. Can your child squish the sound? You could use uppercase too!

Use rice, pasta, lentils, salt, flour etc. Anything you have, poured into a small container that your children can practice forming letters in!

Sing along to your favourite rhymes/learn new ones or make up a song of your own!

Read a story and search for a few chosen tricky words in there! Can you spot them?
